

#### **Excess Soil Engagement**

The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) recently completed public consultations on a regulatory proposal for excess soil management. This proposal supports the direction in Ontario's proposed Environmental Plan, which speaks to recognizing that excess soil is often a resource that can be reused and setting clear rules to allow industry to reduce construction costs. This proposal included the following elements for review:

- A new proposed On-Site and Excess Soil Management Regulation
- Complementary amendments to Regulation 347 (Waste)
- Amendments to O. Reg 153/04 (Records of Site Condition)
- A proposed document to be adopted by reference in the On-Site and Excess Soil

The proposal would increase opportunities for the appropriate and beneficial reuse of excess soil:

- Recognize excess soil as a resource
- Set clear rules to increase reuse opportunities and reduce soil relocation costs
- Reduce clean excess soil going to landfill as waste
- Lower greenhouse gas emissions associated with excess soil movement
- Protect human health and the environment




 Recently, the MEA published articles on MCEA reform in the May edition of Milestone and the June edition of Environmental Science and Engineering Magazine.

## OPS Presentation at OWWA Conference

In its role as the partner custodian of OPS, MEA provided a presentation during the Certification & Education Session at the 2019-OWWA Conference in May. MEA's Member Services Coordinator, Amin Mneina collaborated with OPS Watermains Committee member, Ray Miller to deliver a well received informational presentation on Past, Present, and Future of OPS.

#### **OPSS MUNI 100 GC**

The OPS GC Committee is finalising the revision and update of the OPS MUNI 100 GC in reference to the new Construction Act. The updated document will be part of the OPS November publication. The MEA is planning to summarise and highlight the updates in a summary document which will be shared with members. Check our Latest News section at our website for updates.



#### **OPS Traffic Safety Committee - MEA Alert**

For several decades, the Ministry of Transportation's acceptance of roadside safety products has been based on full scale crash testing in accordance with standardized methods. As MTO's construction standards and standard drawings are replaced and updated, Ontario Provincial Standards will be making this transition as well, replacing and updating OPSDs and OPSS.MUNIs as documents are submitted to OPS through the Traffic Safety Committee.

The Ministry of Transportation is in the process of transitioning to the use of MASH tested hardware in its design and construction standards, following a timeline roughly parallel with FHWA. During this process, standards for NCHRP Report 350 tested hardware is being cancelled and replaced with MASH tested devices.

It is important to highlight that the transition to MASH tested products is still ongoing. This document contains a list of cancelled, updated, and new specifications and drawings made to date. A follow-up document may be published in the future when the transition is substantially complete with a complete list of changes.
